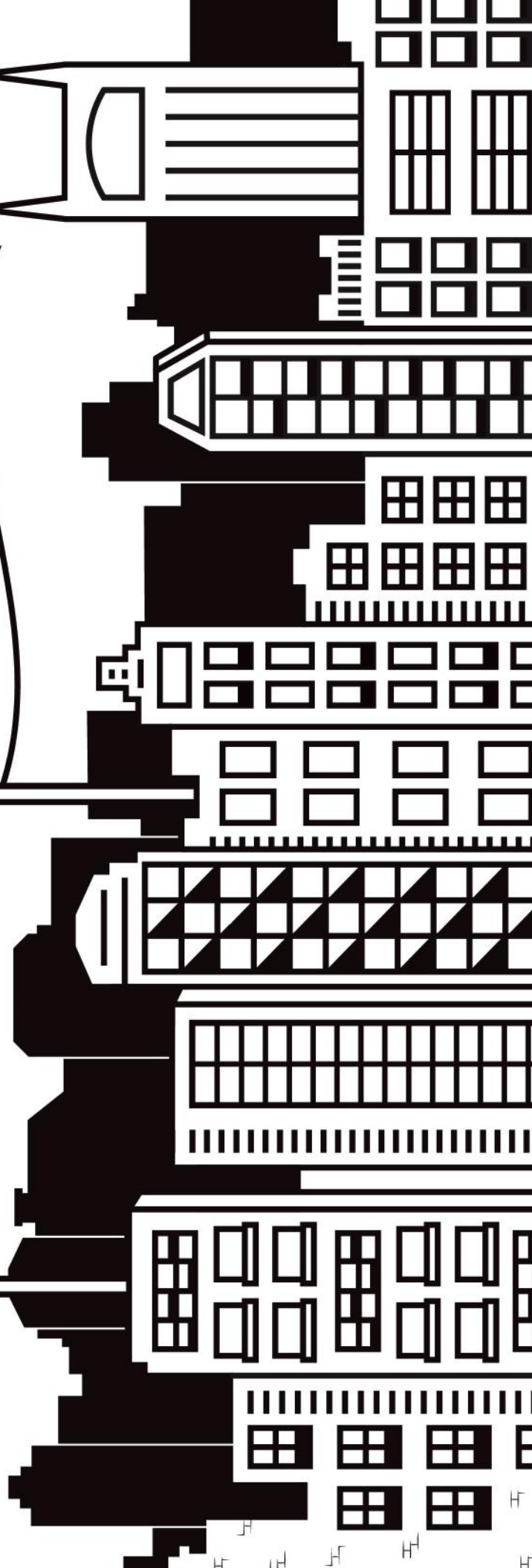
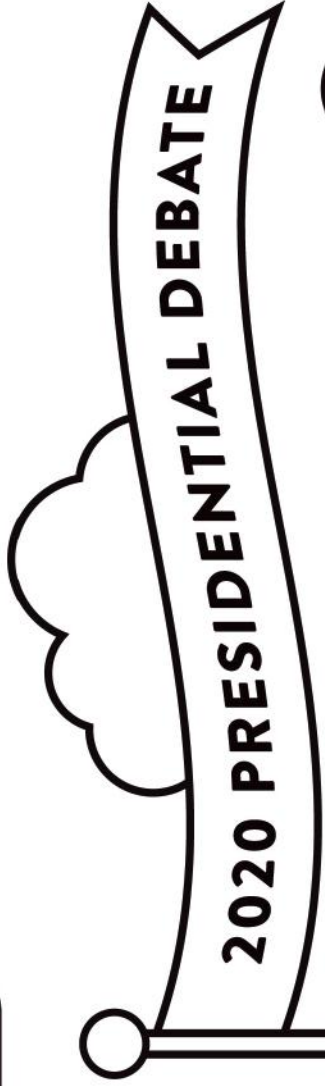
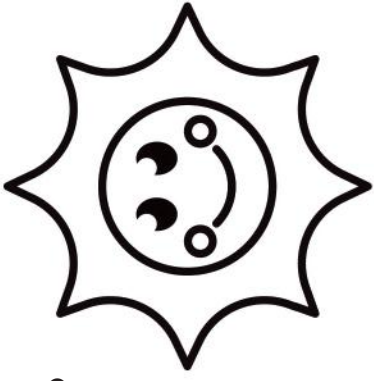
The process for selecting a president is lengthy and involves many different steps. Help Belmont's mascot, Bruiser, find his way from the start of the election all the way to voting day.

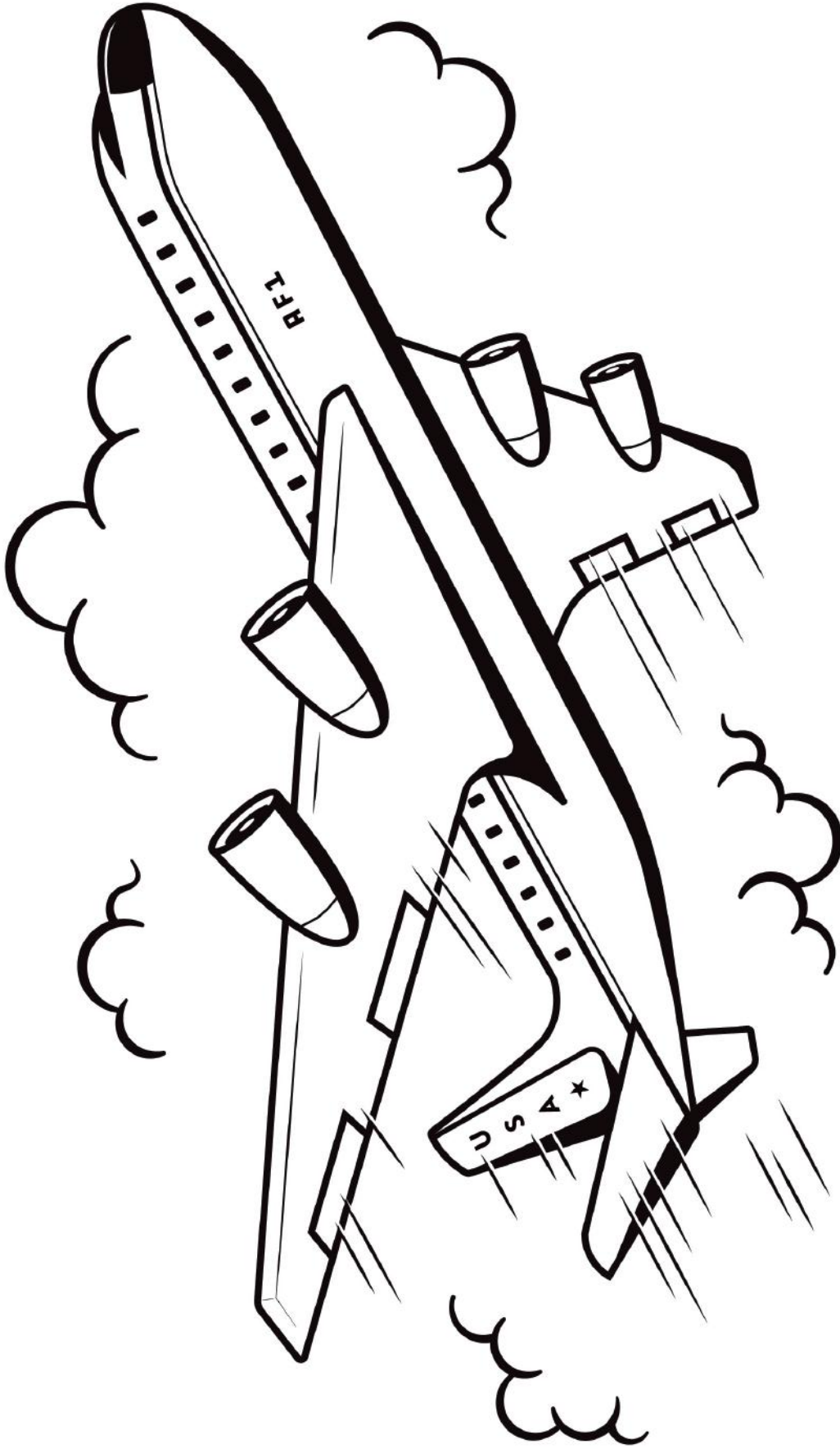

AIR FORCE ONE IS THE NAME OF THE AIRPLANE THE PRESIDENT USES TO TRAVEL THE WORLD.

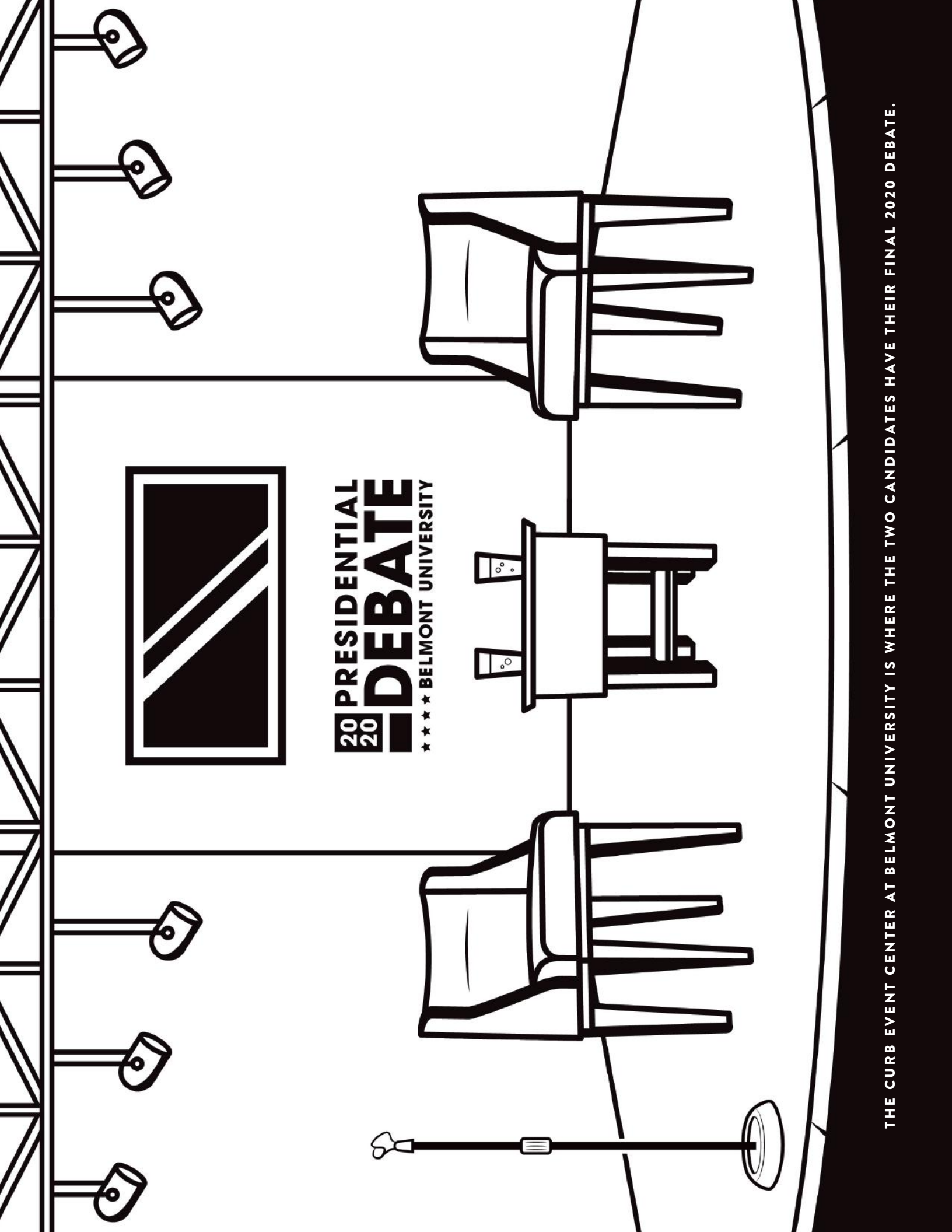

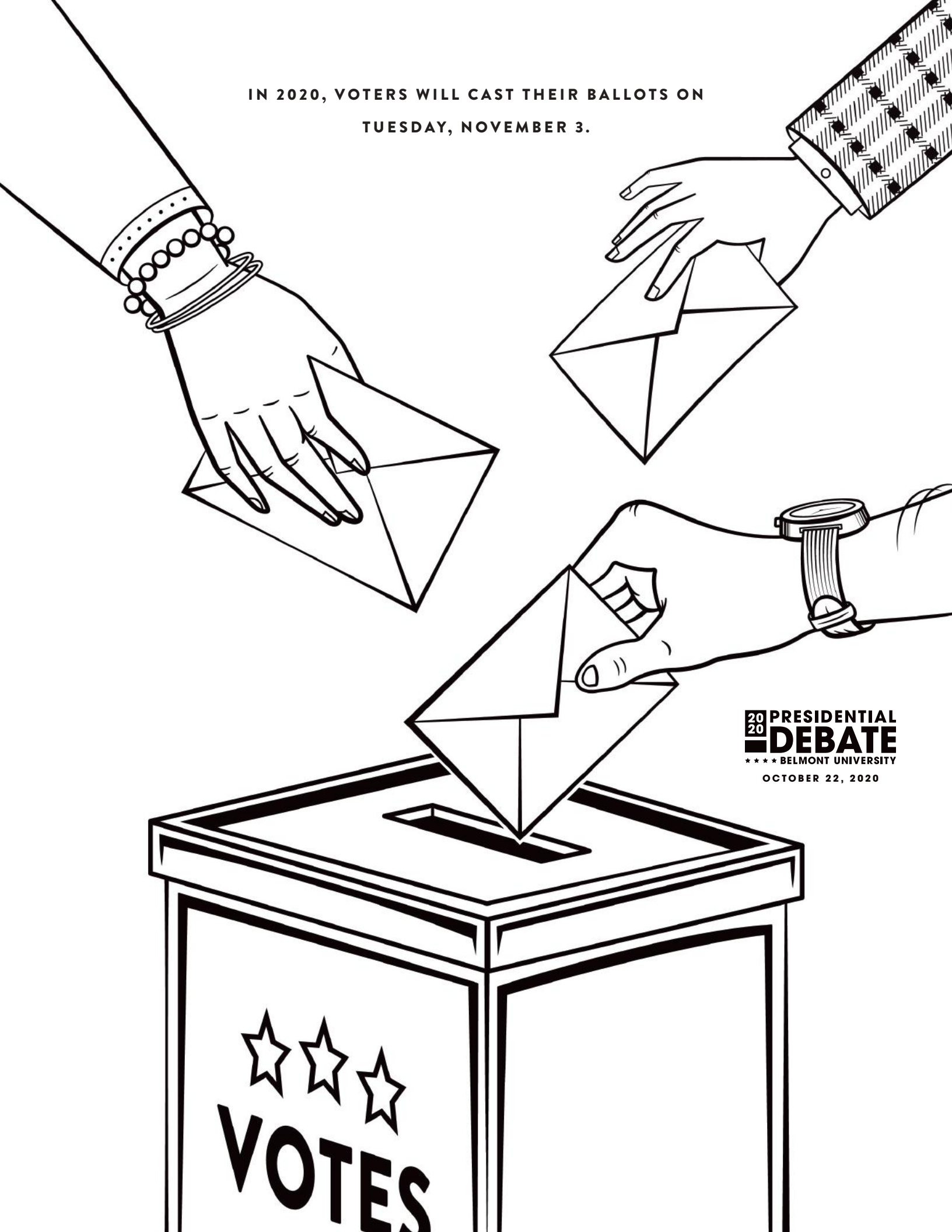
